

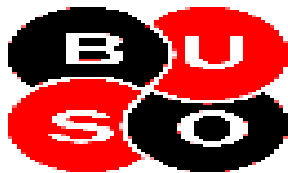

9.00 credits in SOSC

#### REPEATING A COURSE

A passed or failed course may be repeated once for degree credit. When a course is repeated for degree credit, the second grade will be calculated in the grade point average. However, the record of both, the first and the second attempt, will appear on the transcript.

This restriction is also applicable to cross-listed or course credit exclusions.
